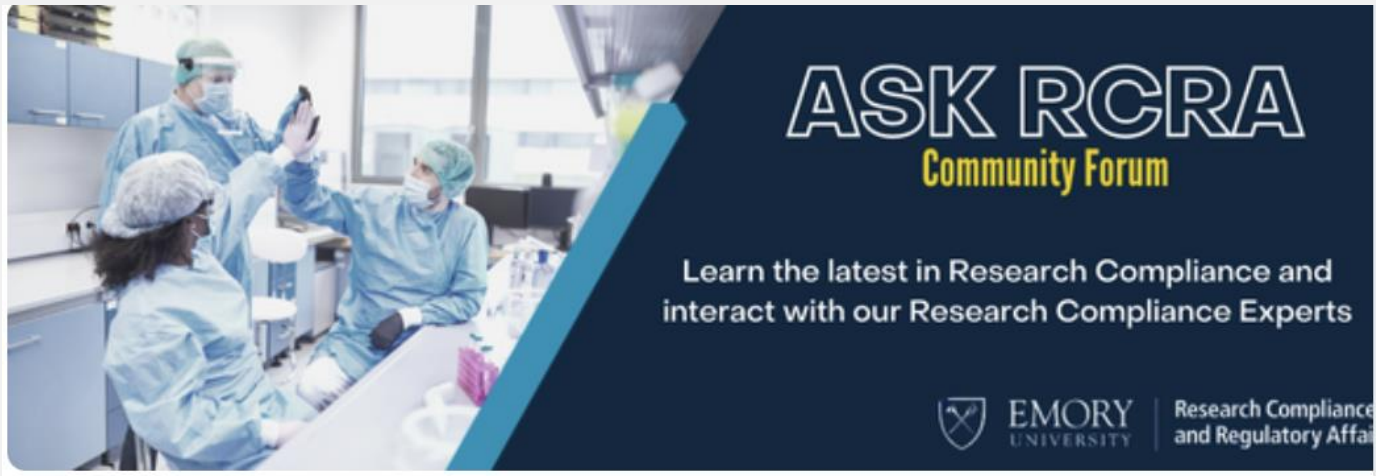

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Federal funding disclosure requirement that mandates public transparency for projects supported by the U.S. Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education.

Core Requirements

When issuing public-facing materials, statements, or documents about a federally funded project, recipients must clearly state:

- **Federal Share Percentage:** The exact percentage of the total project costs financed with federal money.
- **Federal Dollar Amount:** The exact dollar amount of federal funds allocated.
- **Non-Governmental Share:** The percentage and exact dollar amount financed by non-federal or non-governmental sources.

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The disclosure must be included when organizations publicly communicate or promote their programs. Examples include:

- Press releases and public statements
- Requests for proposals (RFPs) and bid solicitations
- Project websites and digital media
- Brochures, flyers, and fact sheets
- Reports, presentations, and publications
