What is an ORCID iD?

- ORCID = global not-for-profit organization run by and for the research community
- ORCID iD = a free, unique, digital persistent identifier (DPI) for researchers

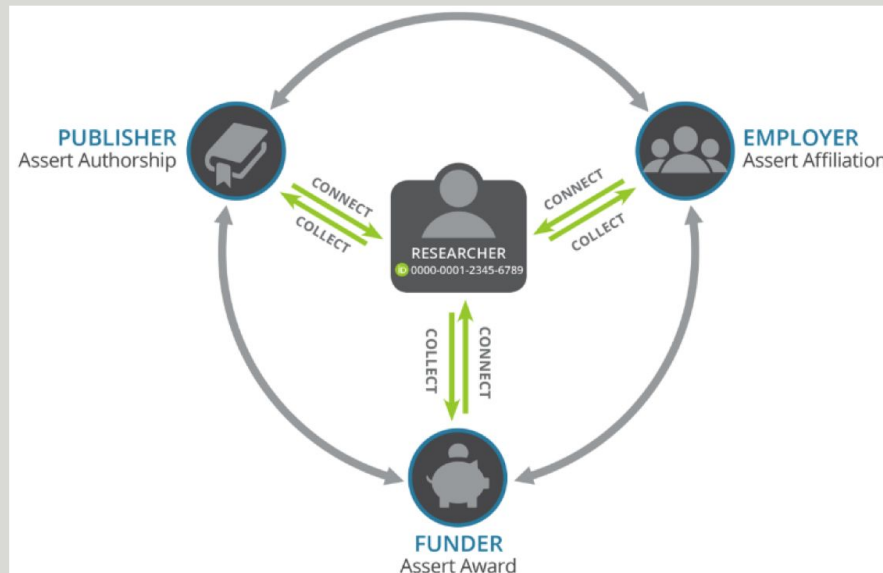

What are some benefits of an ORCID iD for you?

- Eliminates problems with name similarities, variant spellings of names in non-Roman alphabets, name changes, etc.
- Allows researchers to populate their record like a CV
- Saves time: Enter once, reuse often (e.g., grant applications)
- Stays with you throughout your career
- Interoperability with major research databases

Why are we talking about ORCID now?

- Emory must comply with [National Security Presidential Memo 33](#) (NSPM-33), which **directs researchers receiving federal funds to use a digital persistent identifier (DPI) starting in 2023.** ([implementation guidance](#)).
- ORCID is the only DPI that meets all NSPM-33 requirements.
- 100+ publishers require authors to have an ORCID iD.



What does connecting my ORCID iD to Emory do?

- Emory OIT has integrated ORCID into many internal systems such as ESD (Emory Shared Data), Compass, EBI (Emory Business Intelligence), and more.
- Connecting to Emory via <https://orcid.emory.edu> sets Emory as a **trusted organization** within your ORCID record, allowing Emory to read that data.

Reminder: New NIH Data-Sharing Requirements

- Effective date: Jan. 25, 2023
- New policy requires investigators and institutions to:
 - Plan and budget for the managing and sharing of data
 - Submit a data management and sharing (DMS) plan for review when applying for funding
 - Comply with the approved DMS plan
