OFFICE OF RESEARCH INTEGRITY AND COMPLIANCE (ORIC)

ORIC guides the research community in the areas of FDAregulated research, controlled substances and dangerous drugs, research misconduct allegation review, and responsible conduct of research training. CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND COMMITMENT OFFICE (COI/COC)

COI/COC provides oversight, systemic safeguards, and regulatory expertise to identify and manage financial conflicts of interest in research and conflicts of commitment that could impact research and scholarly activities. In doing so, we support Emory investigators and scholars in maintaining integrity in their research efforts and discoveries. **Website**

INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC)

IACUC provides oversight over the humane and ethical animal care and use of animals in research. The IACUC ensures compliance with federal regulations, reviews and approves all animal projects, inspects animal facilities and laboratories, investigates animal concerns, and performs reviews of the University's animal programs. EXPORT CONTROL OFFICE (ECO)

ECO is responsible for administering Emory's export control compliance program. The ECO helps Emory remain compliant with federal regulations related to exports by developing administrative processes, designing compliance tools, providing training, and serving as a resource for departments, faculty, and staff. The eDisclose system from Huron brings new features and functionality to help manage the disclosure of financial interests and outside activities. The system will provide new functionality and features released on an ongoing basis to meet evolving federal regulatory requirements.
