Updated Policies

The following IACUC policies were updated this month.

Policy 309: <u>Identification and Genotyping Methods</u> changes include when is toe-clipping allowed, removal of ethylchloride spray, changes to the Genotyping/ Identification Summary Chart

Policy 313 <u>Sanitation of Research Equipment Used with Animals</u>: a clarification has been added to Attachment 1 – General Sanitization Procedures

Policy 354 <u>Education and Training</u>: AALAS training requirement Inhalation Anesthesia Systems for Rodents for researchers performing survival procedures in rodents.

IACUC Site Inspections

The next semiannual Site inspections cycle will start on 6/1/2023. Here are our lessons learned from this inspection cycle:

After registering, you will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the meeting.

- Personnel handling animals must read and follow the approved protocol.
- Confirm that individuals are assigned to the procedures they will be conducting and review any additional training or assessments that may be required (i.e. surgery assessment, cervical dislocation).
- Check drugs and materials to be used in or with animals to avoid using expired materials or drugs.
- Be aware of the monitoring requirements for your approved procedures.

In preparation for the site inspections, researchers will receive notification emails from the IACUC Office regarding the date, time and the site inspection checklist to prepare for the inspection.

Protocol Submission Deadlines

The IACUC Committee meets on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the Month. Deadlines for FCR review are the Wednesday one week PRIOR to the meeting date for the agenda to be disseminated to members. DMR reviews are rolling submissions and do not have a "deadline".
