Are you using a Dangerous Drug in your Research?

All Emory Researchers who are using dangerous drugs in their research are required to have a GBP Researcher license and log the use. Georgia Board of Pharmacy (GBP) has a regulation that identifies over 2000 drugs/chemicals and prescription drugs as a "dangerous drug" (DD).

How do I tell the difference between a DD and an unregulated substance?



Is the drug/chemical defined as a DD according to O.C.G.A. § 16-13-71?

Check the GDNA <u>website</u> or use this <u>spreadsheet</u>, available on the ORIC website, to see if any of the drugs/chemicals used in your research are on the DD list or;



Did I use my GBP License to purchase the drug/chemical?

A good rule of thumb is that if you used your GBP license to purchase the drug/chemical then you need to log it or;



Does the package have a "Rx Only" label on it?

All drugs that have the "Rx Only" label on them must be logged.

If you answer yes to any of the above questions, then you are using a dangerous drug.

The use of DD requires that you are appropriately licensed, track the receipt, use, and disposition of your DD and store it in a locked substantially constructed cabinet. If you are using DD and not licensed, please contact ORIC@emory.edu to apply for a GBP Researcher license.
