Know the Basics!

What is RM?

Research Misconduct involves fabrication (inventing data or results), fabrication (manipulating data or materials) or plagiarism (using others work without credit) in any stage of the research process, funded or not.



Reporting RM

Emory Policy 7.8 encourages anyone to report suspected research misconduct to the Research Integrity Officer (RIO). Those who make good faith reports are protected. Concerns or meeting requests can be directed to the RIO's office at rio@emory.edu.

Importance

Research misconduct (RM) can severely affect the research community, institutions, individual scientists, and the overall credibility of research. It may occur across various formats, including publications, presentations, posters, funding applications, theses, and internal reports.



Review Process

Policy 7.8, mandates that all involved are treated fairly and maintains confidentiality by limiting information sharing to only those who need to know. The allegations are reviewed in stages, with consultation with the Respondent School.
